

ORDINANCE NO. 366

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF PENALTIES TO THE TOWN OF ST. JOHN FOR VIOLATION OF STATUTES, ORDINANCES, AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE USE, STANDING OR PARKING OF VEHICLES UPON STREETS, ALLEYS OR OTHER PUBLIC PLACES IN THE TOWN OF ST. JOHN AND AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING ORDINANCES CONCERNING SUCH STREETS, ALLEYS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES.

WHEREAS, the Town of St. John has provided for violations in the use of vehicles upon the streets, alleys and other public places in the Town of St. John, among others not specified herein being described as ordinances numbers 208, 209 and 210, and

WHEREAS, the Trustees of the Town of St. John by ordinance has:

- a. Controlled and regulated the standing or parking of vehicles upon streets, alleys and other public places in the Town.
- b. Or regulated traffic by means of traffic control signals within the Town.
- c. Or designated particular streets as one-way streets and require that vehicles move in a specific direction.
- d. Or regulated the speed of the vehicles on the streets, alleys and public places within the Town.
- e. Or designated streets as a through street and require that vehicles stop before entering or crossing the same.
- f. Or designated any intersection as a stop intersection and require vehicles to stop at one or more entrances to such intersection.
- g. And prescribed penalties for persons violating ordinances relating to the above matters, and

WHEREAS, the Acts of the State of Indiana 1969, Ch. 252, Sec. 418, p. 987 known as Burns Indiana Statutes Annotated 48-326 and Indiana Code 18-3-1-52 provide for the establishment of a proceeding

for the handling of violations by vehicles on the streets, alleys and public ways, and payment to the Clerk-Treasurer of the Town for the benefit of the General Fund in lieu of being charged in a Justice of the Peace Court, Town Court or other Court of competent jurisdiction.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of St. John, Lake County, Indiana, under authority of Acts of Indiana 1969, Ch. 252, Sec. 418, p. 987 as follows:

Section 1. That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the ordinances of the Town of St. John, which regulate the use, standing or parking of vehicles upon streets, alleys or other public places, may, in lieu of being charged for such violation in a Justice of the Peace Court or Town Court or other Court of competent jurisdiction, pay to the Clerk-Treasurer of the Town of St. John, a penalty of \$2.00 for a standing or parking violation and a penalty of \$15.00 for moving violations for the benefit of the General Fund of such town. Such penalties shall be paid within seven days of the date of the violation. Upon failure to pay any penalty herein prescribed in accordance with provisions hereof, such violator shall be charged forthwith pursuant to State Law.

Section 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance amends and supplements all ordinances of the Town of St. John which provide for the payment of penalties or fines for violations of vehicles upon streets, alleys or other public places.

Section 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any and all ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that an emergency exists for the immediate taking effect of this ordinance and therefore the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with law.
