AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE #771 AND ALL AMENDMENTS THERETO BEING AN "ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A SCHEDULE OF WAGES AND SALARIES FOR THE TOWN OF ST. JOHN, LAKE COUNTY, INDIANA, FOR THE TOWN EMPLOYEES, FIRE AND POLICE PERSONNEL AND TOWN OFFICIALS."

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of St. John, Lake County, Indiana, finds it appropriate to amend the schedule of wages and salaries for the Town of St. John, Lake County, Indiana which consists of Ordinance No. 771, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of St. John, Lake County, Indiana, finds it proper and appropriate to amend Subsection M of said ordinance regarding Part Time Clerical - Building Department to Part or Full Time Clerical - Building Department; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council is amending said ordinance and the foregoing subsection at the request of the Town Clerk-Treasurer.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Council of the Town of St. John, Indiana, that the following schedule of wages and salaries for Town Employees, be and are hereby established and shall commence instanter to wit:

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| M) Part and Full Time Clerical - Building Department | \$6.45 per hour, payable every two weeks, from the General Fund |
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
BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any and all ordinances or parts thereof establishing compensation, wages, or salaries for Town Employees, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed.

That an emergency exists for the immediate taking effect of this ordinance from and after its passage and the compensation and salary referred to herein shall be paid as set forth herein beginning instanter and continuing thereafter.
