

TOWN OF ST. JOHN, LAKE COUNTY, INDIANA

ORDINANCE NO. 1437

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TOWN ORDINANCE NO. 1243, BEING: "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A FEE FOR RECYCLING CONTAINERS IN THE TOWN OF ST. JOHN AND AMENDING TO THE EXTENT APPLICABLE, ORDINANCE NO. 985, 'AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS AND ESTABLISHING FEES FOR THE SAME' ", REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND TOWN CODE SECTIONS, OR PARTS THEREOF, IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, AND ALL MATTERS RELATED HERETO.

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of St. John, Lake County, Indiana, has been informed and advised by its administrative personnel that the cost to the Town for recycling containers is presently the amount of Thirty-One and 00/100 Dollars (\$31.00) per container; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of St. John, Lake County, Indiana, has been further informed and advised by its administrative personnel that the cost of the recycling container, including the actual cost of the container, storage of same and delivery to existing residential homeowners for an additional container as well as delivery to new residences has increased; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of St. John, Lake County, Indiana, has reviewed the information provided by its administrative personnel regarding the increase of costs for recycling containers, as well as the need to continue to supply and provide same upon request by existing households or upon occupancy of newly constructed residential homes, and has reviewed such recommendations herein; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of St. John, Lake County, Indiana, having reviewed the recommendation and information provided by its administrative staff, and being duly advised, now determines that it is advisable, necessary and appropriate, as well as in the best interests of the residents of the Town, that in order to defray the cost of additional recycling containers, the established fee should be increased, and for new residential homes, that the occupancy permit fee should appropriately be increased to defray and cover the cost of said recycling containers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ST. JOHN, LAKE COUNTY, INDIANA:

SECTION ONE: That SECTION 1. of Town Ordinance No. 1243 be, and the same is hereby amended to read and provide as follows, namely:

"SECTION 1. That there is hereby established a fee of \$50.00, which shall be charged to each and every household per each additional recycling container requested by any such current and existing household".

SECTION TWO: That SECTION 2. of Town Ordinance No. 1243 be, and the same is hereby amended to read and provided as follows, namely:

"SECTION 2. That the occupancy permit fee established by Town Ordinance No. 985 and Town Ordinance No. 1243, as each have been amended, shall be increased by the amount of \$50.00 for each recycling container provided or requested on newly constructed residential homes."


SECTION THREE: That all existing Town Code Section and Ordinances, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby deemed null, void, and of no legal effect, and are specifically repealed.


